2015 Dues Cards are in!!!

If you do not want the frequent renewal notices from National American Legion, now is the time to bring your 2015 dues to the Post. You can give them to the bartenders and they will get the dues to the Adjutant.

Our membership goal for 2015 is 698 members. We were just slightly short of this number last year and the Commander wants to be 100% this year. You can do your part by renewing and inviting an eligible veteran to join.

The dues year goes from 1 July – 30 June. So no matter when you renewed (or joined) your next year dues need to be paid on or after 1 July. When you pay your dues, \$26 goes to Austin (Department) and then on to National (Indianapolis). After that is done, you will have your membership updated in the data base for National and will be off the renewal mailing list. As you can see, this does not happen overnight.

You have the option of paying on-line. So far we have had over 35 members renew through the website: legion.org. This is the National website so your renewal is recorded much quicker. It saves time and money. The Adjutant gets notified that there are on-line renewals and sends out the 2015 card.

It's, also, "**Early Bird**" season. If you pay your dues (Legion, SAL or ALA) prior to the Chicken Fried Steak Dinner in October, you will get a special price for the dinner and be eligible for prizes. There are several really great prizes being talked about. Stay tuned – final plans have not been finalized.

Boys State Testimonial

To the American Legion Post 593,

I am a Texas Boys State graduate of 2014 and as I pledged, I am writing an after action review of my experiences at Boys State. I won the election for city and county delegate for Berry City and Benefield County, as I progressed through the political ladder, I received exposure and earned the acceptance and respect of my fellow statesmen. I was also the city color guard for my party. I gave short, three minute speeches in which I was to express to the city and county what I stood for and why I was the best candidate for the position. As the crowds grew larger, the primaries came by, and I gave my speech for governor. Even though I received praises for my speech such as it being "a dynamite speech", I was hit hard when I did not win the election. Instead of giving up on the program and closing myself to the opportunities it presented, I decided to see this as an opportunity to show perseverance and to not give up, always keeping in mind the first advice I received there: "you will get from it as much or as little as you put into it". So I put myself to work and became involved in the Federalist Party's Platform Committee. In it I helped create the political agenda for my party in concern to immigration. I created a bill in which a "Progressive Visa" was put in place and made legal immigration seem much more feasible than illegal immigration. The day before the final elections came, I was informed that a position for Benefield County Sheriff candidate for the Federalist Party opened up, so I took that chance and ended up winning. Boys State not only taught me about the political system and procedure, it also showed me how to deal with adversity through determination and hard work and that if I set my mind to anything, and as long as I believe it I can accomplish it. Boys State is definitely a life changing experience which has shaped me and influenced me greatly and for the good. I met wonderful people with whom I could easily relate and everyone there was kind and open to conversations. I strongly encourage the continuation of the program, it is a wonderful program, one worth keeping and improving. I would like to thank the Commandant Staff, especially Major Joe Claburn for introducing me to the program and to the concept of the American Legion. The American Legion Post 593 for their cooperation, support, and kind treatment, I felt since the first day I walked in for the interview that it was a place where I truly belonged. And finally the Boys State program for giving me such a memorable week and an excellent experience.
