The Marine Honor Guard and the COO of History Flight, Justin LeHew will be in attendance to honor Pfc Hancock. History Flight is dedicated to researching, recovering, and bringing home America's servicemen who have been listed as Missing in Action (MIA) during past American conflicts. You can read more about Pfc Hancock in this newsletter. Please come out and show your support for this hero.

AFTER 77 YEARS, REMAINS OF MISSING MARINE RETURNED

On 24 Feb. 2021, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced that Marine Corps Reserve Pfc. J.L. Hancock, 21, killed during World War II, was accounted for on 17 Feb. 2021, after 77 years.

John Loss Hancock – known for most of his short life as "JL" – was born in the small Texas Panhandle town of McLean on 8 May 1922. He was the third of five children born to William and Ethel Amanda (Boyles) Hancock. JL helped out with the farm while balancing his schoolwork. He loved the life of a farmer, and as a member of Future Farmers of America judged local agricultural competitions. JL proved to be an "excellent student" as well as a promising farmer, and graduated from McLean High School in 1940



Like so many young men of that time, he was eager to serve his county. Hancock enlisted in the Marine Corps at Oklahoma City on 17 February 1942 – he gave his initials, so military documents also refer to him as "J. L. Hancock" – and were soon on his way to boot camp in San Diego. He qualified as a rifle marksman, and was ordered to the Fleet Marine Force for duty. On 18 April 1942, he reported to Company B, 1st Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division.

Hancock would serve with B/1/6 for the entirety of his time in the Marines. He participated in action at Guadalcanal in January and February 1943; while he escaped wounds or serious injury, he did contract malaria and the recurring infection would trouble him during the months his regiment spent in New Zealand.

In October 1943, Hancock and his company boarded ships at Hawke's Bay, New Zealand and shipped out for their next operation – the invasion of Betio in the Tarawa atoll, part of the Gilbert Islands.

PFC Hancock's company landed on the island of Betio, Tarawa atoll, on the night of 21 November 1943. The battalion arrived ashore at Green Beach in rubber boats, and prepared for a morning attack to the east which would turn the flank of Japanese positions and help establish contact between hard-hit and depleted units still trapped along the Red beaches.

After a day of hard fighting, Baker Company dug in and prepared a night defense. They were in an exposed position, and that night a force of several hundred Japanese troops hit their lines, breaking through in a few places and causing chaos and mayhem through the night and into the early morning hours of 22 November. Ultimately, the Marines held, but paid a stiff price for maintaining their positions. Over the three days of intense fighting at Tarawa, approximately 1,000 Marines and Sailors were killed and more than 2,000 were wounded, while the Japanese were virtually annihilated.

One of the casualties of 22 November was PFC J. L. Hancock. He was hit in the head by pieces of shrapnel and died in the field – sadly, just thirty minutes before the last Japanese resistance was overcome. Later that day, Hancock and nearly thirty other men – many from his own First Battalion, 6th Marines – were laid to rest in a trench grave near where they fell. The location, known as "Row D" of the East Division Cemetery, renamed Cemetery 33, was later obliterated and the grave sites lost to the shifting sands of the tiny island.

In 1946 the U.S. Army Graves Registration Unit came back to Tarawa to identify the many grave sites and move them to a more formal gravesite on the island. Some had been buried in individual graves while others were buried side by side in trenched graves. The unit was only able to locate about half of the fallen soldiers to inter them in the new gravesite. Later in 1946, the unit moved their bodies to Hawaii for identification and return to their families. Over 500 of the Marine's remains including those of PFC J.L. Hancock were never located and were declared "non-recoverable" on 4 October 1949.

His family had a memorial marker placed in McLean Cemetery, McLean, TX, in hopes that one day JL would be found and returned home. His parents would later be laid to rest next to his marker.

Hancock's remains were recovered from Betio by the non-profit organization History Flight in 2019. Archaeologists excavated a burial feature known as "Row D" of Cemetery 33 and uncovered more than thirty potential Marine remains. Original burial rosters for the roll included thirty names, plus two unidentified Marines.

Original records placed Hancock in Grave #15 of this cemetery. His remains were among those recovered by the History Flight team and sent back to the United States for laboratory analysis. In May 2020 his family was contacted, and offered the opportunity to provide a Family Reference DNA Sample.

At long last, on 17 February 2021, PFC JL Hancock was officially accounted for and will be returned to his family and laid to rest on 4 August 2021 at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery in San Antonio, TX. Reception to follow at Post 593, Converse TX.

PFC JL Hancock is memorialized at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, Punchbowl Crater, Honolulu, Hawaii. PFC Hancock's name shall remain permanently inscribed within Court 4 of the "Courts of the Missing" but a rosette will be placed next to JL's name, indicating that his remains have been returned.
