A Letter from the Sons of the American Legion Detachment Commander

Replace the Pain Project

Suicide doesn't take away the pain, it gives it to someone else. Too many people choose to end their own lives for a variety of reasons, but the common thread in every act of suicide is pain. There are many good mental health programs that address the issue of suicide among veterans and active-duty members, but children are rarely mentioned.

As S.A.L. Detachment of Texas Commander, I have created a service project specifically for children of military families. The project will succeed only with your help. It is called Replace the Pain. We will strive to replace the pain with hope and optimism. Together, we can work to reduce the incidence of child suicide in military families. Sadly, it does happen. One child ending their own life is one too many!

I have reached out to Communities in Schools South Central Texas; a non-profit organization that empowers students to achieve. One of the areas of their expertise is in Mental Health and Counseling. In their 2023 Impact Report they state, "CIS supports the mental health of students and families in two ways: Site Coordinators provide daily interventions, referrals, parent consultations, individual and group counseling or supportive guidance, suicidal ideation and self-harm interventions. Clinical counselors provide intensive, solution-focused therapy to students experiencing anxiety, depression, self-harming behaviors or suicidal ideation and the like. The opportunity is provided to those who experience barriers to accessing care in the community. This initiative is provided at no additional cost to the district and families."

Life is rough, but a child should not get to a point where they believe death is the only way out of a situation. Every child is a potential nurse, master of the arts, plumber, attorney, CEO, space explorer, admiral, teacher, electrician, luthier, movie star, world leader, house builder, soldier, author, scientist, etc. The only way to find out is to help them grow into adulthood and achieve their potential.

By this time, you're probably asking how you can help. There are two ways. The first is with financial donations. Have squadron fundraisers and make the check payable to the American Legion Department of Texas. Specify that the donation is for the Replace the Pain Project. The money will be donated to CIS. CIS will designate the S.A.L. donations to help the children of military families in the service area.

The other way to help is through personal donation of time. Time is the most valuable thing we possess and the greatest gift we can give. If there is a child you know that might be at risk of self-harm, reach out and let the child and their family know that you are there to help. You can get the child involved in an activity at which you excel. Teach the child. Share your knowledge. Give the child a purpose, something to look forward to and be excited about. Make them part of the Legion family. Help them get involved in life and in living. Let them know someone cares.

All of us working together can make this program successful and ensure that it is still relevant and helping those in need long after we have been transferred to Post Everlasting.


