VA SWITCHING TO ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS

If you are receiving your Federal payments from the Dept. of Veterans Affairs (VA) by paper check, you will need to <u>switch to electronic payments by March 1,</u> <u>2013.</u> You can receive your benefits electronically in one of two ways:(1) by direct deposit or (2) by prepaid debit card where the U.S. Treasury deposits your benefits directly to a debit card. This is an option if you do not have a bank account and do not want to open one. You can request a debit card by calling (800) 333-1795 (Mon-Fri, 8am-8pm ET). Boy's State

The American Legion has many programs that are designed to link our great organization with the Community as well as help the youth of America grow into stronger citizens. These include American Legion Baseball, Boy Scouts of America, the Junior Shooting Program, and Boy's State to name a few. Each individual Post is encouraged to support as many programs as possible given their level of membership. Post 593 has supported two of these programs for many years: Scouting and Boy's State.

Boy's State is a program that originated in 1935 when two Legionnaires from the Department of Illinois, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card came up with the idea. They wanted to counter the fascist-inspired Youth Pioneer Camps that were becoming prevalent. Their idea quickly grew to the level it is today as well as the formation of Boy's Nation. The American Legion Auxiliary also sponsors a similar program, Girl's State.

Each summer boys that have just completed their Junior year in high school are selected to attend Boy's State in all 50 States. They then come together for one week for an educational program of government instruction at the Local, County, and State levels. Our boys attend this event on the campus of the University of Texas in Austin. Once there, they will form a mock government structure with two political parties. They will elect officials ranging from City Mayor to County Commissioner to Governor and all the positions that support these roles. They will have the opportunity to author Bills and attempt to get them passed through the Congress they elected. In 1979, I attended Boy's State in the State of Montana. I still remember voting on a bill to banish taxes on Milk. Although it may seem very mundane to us now, the lobbying and voting on the legislative floor was very real at the time.

Boy's State builds character by teaching the Rights, Privileges, Duties, and Responsibilities of Citizenship. It teaches Leadership as well as Government Structure and Procedures. Many notable people have attended Boy's State throughout the United States to include Neil Armstrong and Michael Jordan.

I am happy to announce that Post 593 will be sponsoring 6 boys this summer. We are taking applications from Judson and Wagner High Schools as well as TMI. I expect the interview process to be a tough decision just to select only 6. I am excited to be a part of a program that is helping our youth grow into valuable leaders and citizens. They are the future of our Great Nation. I hope that all of you feel the same way. Step up if you are asked to help with fund-raisers for either Boy's or Girl's State.
