Want to put the following in writing as and Official Position of the District Leadership, so that EVERY POST COM-MANDER is aware of the challenge. For the past few years the District has sponsored to Boys State about 30 to 38 boys. It is our goal to reach 50 plus boys this year. If we can get every Post to buy in to supporting three boys we could reach a minimum of 57 boys this year. At a cost of \$275.00 per boy plus \$25.00 in spending money that is a cost of \$900.00 to each Post. Lots of money, however if your Post can salt away \$90.00 per month, we are 10 months away from the departure of the boys, the \$900.00 is attainable. Also, please don't forget the possibility of having a community business sponsor a boy for your Post. The foregoing is in no way intended to minimize the efforts of those Post that annually sponsor five to 10 boys each year, please keep up the good work. The basis of this goal is to get the TOTAL District on the same page and support the American Legions number one Americanism program. I know I can count on each of you. Want help? This is the second time this subject has been addressed in the Newsletter and it is our plan to continue to keep this vital issue in the forefront of all of our thoughts.

If you weren't at District meeting you missed the report from our Judge Advocate and Department National Executive Committeeman Ron Cherry. In short, the National body has proposed via Resolution to increase the yearly dues by \$4.50, and the Department has said that if the Resolution passes it will raise dues by \$1.50. Ron's feeling is the resolution will not pass in Salt Lake, Utah this year, but in most probability will pass in Reno, Nevada next August. Ron also said that when the resolution passes it will not go into effect until early January following its passage. Whenever the Resolution passes, it is obvious that our local dues will need to be increased. Now is the time to get your members to consider taking the Paid Up For Life (PUFL) option. Being a PUFL frees your members and Post from worrying about dues increases. Fore warned is fore armed, or something like that.

Don't forget our next District meeting will be held at Sesquicentennial Post 592 at 106 Lanark, beginning at 7:30pm on Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup>.


