Our next meeting is on 5 November at 7:30 P.M.; hope to see you there. Come out and see what a great group of women we have in our Auxiliary.



American Legion Post 593 Hurricane Relief Efforts

This is a story of our Post 593 coming to the aid of another American Legion Post, Post 291 San Leon Texas. A post ravaged by Hurricane Ike in September of 2008. September 17 Rick Stigall, a member of Post 593, called the American Legion District Commanders for districts 22 and 9. Both districts were in the path of Hurricane Ike and asked if Post 291 in San Leon needed any assistance, the town had been spotlighted on the 10 O'clock news as having been, along with the surrounding area, severely damaged. The only thing remaining of the Post home was the slab.

The Commander of Post 291 stated that they had not received any aid at the time and were in desperate need of water, canned foods, fresh fruit and gasoline for generators. They had no power no water and there were a large number of older citizens in the area that concerned him.

A call went out to the members of Post 593 for volunteers to donate food, water, money and to volunteer to help get any supplies collected down to the Hurricane ravaged area. San Leon was closed to the public and therefore a police escort would be needed, American Legion Post 490 in the South Houston area said they would make arrangements for the police escort. Also Ray Telemann a Major in the Sheriff's department provided the escort into the area.

Our membership responded with great generosity, as did many others, Post 593 donated water, toiletries, canned goods, fresh fruit and money. Upon hearing of the effort put on by Post 593, Post 399 in the southern part of San Antonio sent 30 gallons of fuel and a few generators to San Leon. HEB corporate provided two 53 foot tractor/trailers loaded with water and ice to San Leon. A gentleman by the name of Charles Brigham, who is not a member of the Post but heard of the effort being made, gave a donation of \$150.00 in groceries. The Legion, the Auxiliary, the SAL and the Riders all donated time, effort, money and supplies with an open heart.

The mission of getting supplies to the area was accomplished on 20 September 2008; two pick up trucks filled with supplies and each pulling a trailer also loaded with supplies headed out to South Houston and Post 490. They were met there by the HEB tractor/trailers and 15 Riders along with a police escort. Once at the San Leon site the task of unloading the two tractor/trailers and the two trucks with trailers was accomplished. There was a distribution table set up and the process of distributing of the supplies was accomplished.

This was a major accomplishment for the Post and all of folks that helped, many gave up their time and effort to make the trek to the devastated area and to them we salute you. The efforts of the Riders, Legionnaires, Auxiliary and SAL are with out question looked upon with pride and respect.
